

Just a Bit of Order

Do We Need to Discuss This Now - RONR p.100-125

A motion (or resolution) is a call to action. This is the only way we can make de-cisions in our Posts if we are going to do it fairly. We actually make motions daily in our personal lives like deciding where to dine. Mom says "Let's all go to a nice sit down restaurant. The daughter agrees, but Dad and the two boys want to go to a sports restaurant and the discussion is on!! Eventually a decision is made and typically not all are happy, but they are at least somewhat satisfied with the agreement.

So goes our Posts, but with many decisions to make and lit-

tle time to do it, we need a logical process based on respect for the opinions and time of all in good standing within our Posts. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised is our guideline.

Now RONR has over 100 pages about motions, but what we learn today can be found in pages 100-125 where RONR discusses THE MAIN MOTION. In particular, we will discuss how to dispose of the main motion.

The main motion is the one on the floor, and the only one on the floor that started "I move to..." When this statement is seconded the discussion begins.

Now most of the time we have a great discussion about the motion (also called "the question" since we are deciding upon what to do).

Sometimes the discussion goes a bit long and there are a few more important issues to bring to the body so someone rises to TABLE the motion, "Commander I move to table this motion as we must address...." The Commander immediately takes a vote as this is not debatable. A majority passes TO TABLE and the motion is set aside until the more pressing business is conducted, and then should be brought back to the floor with a motion to TAKE FROM THE TABLE. If this is not done prior to adjournment then the motion evaporates for this meeting, but can be brought up again freshly at the next meeting.

So the big revelation here is that TABLING does not kill the motion, only postpones its discussion to <u>later in the meeting</u>.

If one wants to push the motion to the future, the motion can be COMMITED or REFERRED to a committee for review and recommendation back to the body at a <u>set time in the future</u>. This motion must be seconded, discussed and needs a majority vote.

A motion can also be POST-PONED DEFINITELY to a future meeting under unfinished business with a second, discussion, and a majority vote.

Finally, for at least this article, one can POSTPONE INDEFI-NITELY which essentially kills the motion not to be brought up again in the same form. This should almost never be done if the officers of the post help members form good productive motions. This action must be seconded, debated, and passed with a majority vote.

That's enough for now. Was great seeing all of you at Mid-Winter training.

The American Legion National Constitution and by-laws state that, "no forms or class of membership is authorized, except for regular, active, or paid up for life members". It is highly illegal to accept any social members into your Posts. The American Legion Department of Ohio, take these infractions very seriously and will launch a full investigation if anyone is found to still be accepting social members. If your Post is found to still be accepting social members in the 2025-2026 membership year, your Posts could be at risk of their Charters being revoked. We will continue to send any information that becomes available to us regarding this matter.

Potential Changes to Several

VA Disabilities

The VA is proposing changes to several VA Disabilities:

Mental Health: The VA will focus on symptom severity rather than social or occupational impact when evaluating mental health conditions. This could result in higher ratings for Veterans with severe symptoms while creating more consistency in how claims are evaluated.

Sleep Apnea: Under the updated system, Veterans using a CPAP machine may receive only a 10% rating, a reduction from the current 50%. This marks a major adjustment in compensation for those with service-connected sleep apnea.

Tinnitus: Veterans will no longer receive a separate 10% rating for tinnitus. Instead, tinnitus will only be rated if it's tied to another compensable condition. This could reduce benefits for Veterans who claim tinnitus as a primary condition.

Federal Freeze

Veterans' benefits and support

services will not be impacted by a White House funding freeze order, which aimed to halt federal financial assistance linked to diversity and inclusion initiatives. Acting VA Secretary Todd Hunter confirmed that all VA operations, including health care, benefits, and other veterans' services, would continue unaffected after a review of 44 financial assistance programs by Office of Management and Budget (OMB) officials. A federal judge temporarily blocked the freeze order, ensuring that VA programs will be exempt even if the freeze is reinstated.


The freeze had caused confusion regarding veterans' education, suicide prevention, and homeless assistance grants, among other services. While the order intended to stop funding for diversity, equity, and inclusion programs, VA officials confirmed that these programs were properly verified as exempt. Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee Chairman Jerry Moran praised the decision, emphasizing continued support for veterans and their families.

Cyber Security Tips

Here are five steps Legionnaires can take to ensure robust personal cybersecurity:

1. Use Strong and Unique Passwords: Veterans should create complex, unique passwords for every online account and avoid reusing passwords. A password manager can help keep track of them securely.

- 2. Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA): Activating 2FA on accounts adds an extra layer of protection by requiring a second form of verification (like a code sent to your phone), reducing the risk of unauthorized access.
- 3. Stay Alert to Phishing Scams: Veterans may be targeted by phishing scams, especially those related to military or veterans' benefits. Always verify the source before clicking on links or providing personal information.
- 4. Regularly Update Software: Ensure that all devices (computers, phones, etc.) have the latest software and security patches to protect against known vulnerabilities. This includes antivirus

The mission of The American Legion Buckeye Boys State is to provide an educational and leadership program that exposes young men to the rights and privileges, the duties and responsibilities, and the love for God and Country necessary to being self-governing citizens.

Through a practical, objective, nonpartisan approach, participants in The American Legion Buckeye Boys State program are exposed to fundamental democratic principles in local, county, and state elections and government functions which prepare them for leadership roles as patriotic American citizens.

Buckeye Boys State is a highly structured, intense, "hands on" workshop in Ohio Government.

Candidates selected to Buckeye Boys State must be willing to give The American Legion and Buckeye Boys State an eight-day commitment of their time and 100% willingness to learn and participate.

Candidates are required to attend a Boys State Orientation program in their area. Details on the orientation program are provided to all candidates by the sponsoring Post/Squadron.

THE FINAL SELECTION IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SPONSORING AMER-ICAN LEGION POST. A representative of the Post must meet with the candidate and certify him for acceptance.

American Legion Buckeye Boys State will be June 8th - June 15th, 2025 at Miami University. The Buckeye Boys State application process for delegates will be online again. Once you receive your enrollment form, please return it with the number of delegates your post plans on sending along with your payment by March 15th. You will receive back forms that have a specific code for each delegate to log onto the website and enter their information electronically. Each code is specific for each delegate, so the forms CANNOT BE COP-IED. Enrollment Forms need to be turned in before Citizenship codes can be sent to the delegates.

American Legion Buckeye Boys State also created QR codes to educate students and schools that are unfamiliar with BBS. These codes are for educational and recruitment purposes only and are not delegate applications.

American Legion Buckeye Boys State, the premier Boys State program in the nation, is an eight (8) day "hands on" program which teaches the young men attending the organization, operation, and principles of State, County, and City Government in Ohio, as well as learning experiences about Ohio Courts, Ohio School Boards, Ohio Law Enforcement, Banking and Realty, Social Media operations, and much, much more.

Held on the campus of Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, American Legion Buckeye Boys State annually attracts over 700 of the top High School Junior young men in Ohio.

Individuals sought by Buckeye Boys State to join as staff mentors are not required to have a deep knowledge of government operations in Ohio, although such experience would be welcome and an asset.

The knowledge, expertise, and life experiences of just about any profession that interested parties may have had or may possess can be utilized within Boys State.

Although the majority of Buckeye Boys State staff serve for the full eight (8) days of Boys State, there are a number of positions available, notably in Elections and several Government sections of Boys State that would only require ones' participation for three (3) to four (4) days.

American Legion Buckeye Boys State provides all housing, meals, and supplies for Buckeye Boys State staff.

The greatest expense required of a prospective Buckeye Boys State staff member would be the expense of his or her time.



Oratorical Program



- Quotations must always be indicated as such. Where quotations are more than 10 words in length, the author's name must be given in the manuscript and cited orally.
- It is acceptable to utilize or incorporate short phrases in a foreign language to develop the argument, establish a point, etc. It should be understood that the vast majority of the prepared oration and/or assigned topic must still be delivered in English. Singing is not permitted and will result in immediate disqualification. The contestant may, however, quote a verse(s) of a song(s) provided proper attribution is made.

The Assigned Topic (3-5 Minutes)

• The purpose of the assigned

topic discourse is to test the speaker's knowledge of the subject, the extent of his or her research, and the ability to discuss the topic as related to the basic principles of government under the Constitution

- The assigned topic shall be drawn by the contest official in full view of the audience immediately before the last speaker begins delivery of his or her prepared oration and will be made known to the audience and each contestant approximately five (5) minutes prior to the time of delivery
- The topic will be on some phase of the U.S. Constitution, selected from Articles and Sections as listed under assigned topics for the current year's contest
 - 2025 Assigned topics
 - » Amendment I
 - » Amendment VII
 - » Amendment XVIII
 - » Amendment XXVI

The American Legion Department awards the first-place

winner a \$4,000 Scholarship. The second-place winner receives \$2,000 and the remainder of the contestants equally divide \$3,000.

Flag Etiquette

United States Flag Etiquette

Since 1919, The American Legion as a national organization and the Ohio Department of The American Legion have been strong proponents for educating the general public, especially the students in the nation's schools, on the proper care, display, protection, and disposal of the United States Flag.

The Posts of Ohio conduct many presentations throughout the state on the proper folding, care, and display of the United States Flag.

The Posts of Ohio also conduct proper flag retirement ceremonies for United States flags that are no longer flyable and conduct graveside flag ceremonies for the funerals of deceased veterans.

Flag Display and Respect

(a) The Flag should never be displayed with the union down, except as a signal of dire distress in instances of extreme danger to life or property.

- (b) The Flag should never touch anything beneath it, such as the ground, the floor, water, or merchandise.
- (c) The Flag should never be carried flat or horizontally, but always aloft and free.
- (d) The Flag should never be used as wearing apparel, bedding, or drapery. It should never be festooned, drawn back, nor up, in folds, but always allowed to fall free.

Bunting of blue, white, and red is always arranged with the blue above, the white in the middle, and the red below should be used for covering a speaker's desk, draping the front of the platform, and for decoration in general.

- (e) The Flag should never be fastened, displayed, used, or stored in such a manner as to permit it to be easily torn, soiled, or damaged in any way.
- (f) The Flag should never be used as a covering for a ceiling.
 - (g) The Flag should never have

placed upon it, nor on any part of it, nor attached to it any mark, insignia, letter, word, figure, design, picture, or drawing of any nature.

- (h) The Flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.
- (i) The Flag should never be used for advertising purposes in any manner whatsoever. It should not be embroidered on such articles as cushions or handkerchiefs and the like, printed or otherwise impressed on paper napkins or boxes or anything designed for temporary use and discard. Advertising signs should not be fastened to a staff or halyard from which the Flag is flown.
- (j) No part of the Flag should ever be used as a costume or athletic uniform. However, a flag patch may be affixed to the uniform of military personnel, firemen, policemen, and members of patriotic organizations. The

Flag represents a living country and is itself considered a living thing. Therefore, the lapel flag pin being a replica, should be worn on the left lapel near the heart.

(k) The Flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning. (Disposal of Unserviceable Flags Ceremony)

Flag Retirement

- a) In proper tribute and in memory and love, our Flag becomes faded and worn and must be honorably retired from life.
- b) The approved method of disposing of unserviceable Flags has been by burning.
- c) Such retirement of Flags that have become unserviceable may be done in public with respectful and honorable rites.
- d) The most appropriate day to perform this ceremony is National Flag Day, June 14th.

AMERICAN LEGION DEPARTMENT OF OHIO SCHOLARSHIPS

HISTORY

The American Legion Department of Ohio Scholarship was established in 1971 to assist deserving high school students and veterans attending institutions of higher learning with the ever-increasing costs of higher education.

ONE TIME SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The scholarship offered by the American Legion Department of Ohio is a ONE TIME NON- RENEWABLE award.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION DEADLINE

All scholarship applications mailed to the American Legion Department of Ohio State Head-quarters in Delaware, Ohio must be received by or postmarked by APRIL 15 annually.

SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION / NOTIFICATION

All scholarship applications received will be reviewed by the American Legion Department of Ohio Screening Committee in mid-May with scholarship recipients and non-recipients to

be notified via surface mail or e-mail as soon as possible thereafter.

SCHOLARSHIP JUDGING CRITERIA

The judging criteria utilized by the Ohio American Legion Scholarship Screening Committee to choose the recipients for any scholarships awarded shall be based upon:

The applicant's academic achievement based on course grades; difficulty of the curriculum; ACT scores; participation in school activities and activities outside of the school and a general impression of each applicant's character obtained through a personal statement.

The American Legion Department of Ohio Scholarship consists of the following categories and the criteria required for each category are:

High School Award

High school awards, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, are awarded annually to selected high school seniors, including home schooled and online students, attending high school within the state of Ohio.

Requirements:

- Open statewide.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct descendant of a deceased member of the Ohio American Legion who was in good standing at the time of death.
- Applicant must have a high school and college (if taking college courses) GPA of 3.5 or highor
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

College Student Award

An American Legion Department of Ohio scholarship may be awarded annually to a college student.

Requirements:

- Open statewide.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct descendant of a deceased member of the Ohio American Legion who was in good standing at the time of death.
- Applicant must have a high school and college GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

The amount of each American Legion Department of Ohio college award will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.

Donald L. Lanthorn Award

Donald L. Lanthorn was a lifelong resident of Licking County who served as the State Director of Veteran's Affairs and Rehabilitation for the Ohio American Legion State Headquarters for forty (40) years.

The Donald L. Lanthorn award, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of

the Ohio American Legion, is awarded annually to one (1) selected high school student, including home schooled and online students, or veteran residing in and attending high school in **Delaware, Knox, Licking, Madison, Marion, Morrow or Union counties.** Those applicants not selected for the Lanthorn scholarship may still be eligible for other Department of Ohio scholarships.

Requirements:

- Restricted to high school, home schooled, online or veterans residing in Delaware, Knox, Licking, Madison, Marion, Morrow or Union County.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct descendant of a deceased member of the Ohio American Legion who was in good standing at the time of death.
- Applicant must have a high school and college (if attending college) GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

The amount of the Donald L. Lanthorn scholarship will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.

Durward I. Bernhard Award

Durward I. Bernhard was a lifelong resident of <u>Belmont</u>

County who at the time of his passing, through his estate, provided funds to the American Legion Department of Ohio with the stipulation these funds be used to directly benefit the higher educational pursuits of Belmont County high school students, including home schooled or online students, or veterans residing in Belmont County.

The Durward I. Bernhard award, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, is awarded annually to one (1) selected Belmont County high school student, including home schooled and online students, or veteran residing in Belmont County. Those Belmont County applicants not selected for the Bernhard scholarship may still be eligible for other Department of Ohio scholarships.

Requirements:

- Restricted to high school, home schooled, online students or veterans residing in Belmont County.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct descendant of a deceased member of the Ohio American Legion who was in good standing at the time of death.
- Applicant must have a high school and college (if attending

college) GPA of 3.5 or higher.

• Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

The amount of the Durward I. Bernhard award will be contingent upon the annual earning of the Scholarship Fund.

American Legion/Military Award

One (1) award, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, is awarded annually to a selected American Legion/Military applicant. The applicant must show proof of being a current, paid member of the Ohio American Legion and of serving in the United States military.

Requirements:

- Open statewide.
- Applicant must provide a copy of current year Ohio American Legion membership card.
- Applicant must provide a copy of DD214, Report of Separation from Military Service or if currently on active duty, a copy of the military identification card.
- Applicant must have a high school and college (if attending college) GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 23 or higher.

The amount of the award to an American Legion/Military applicant will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.
